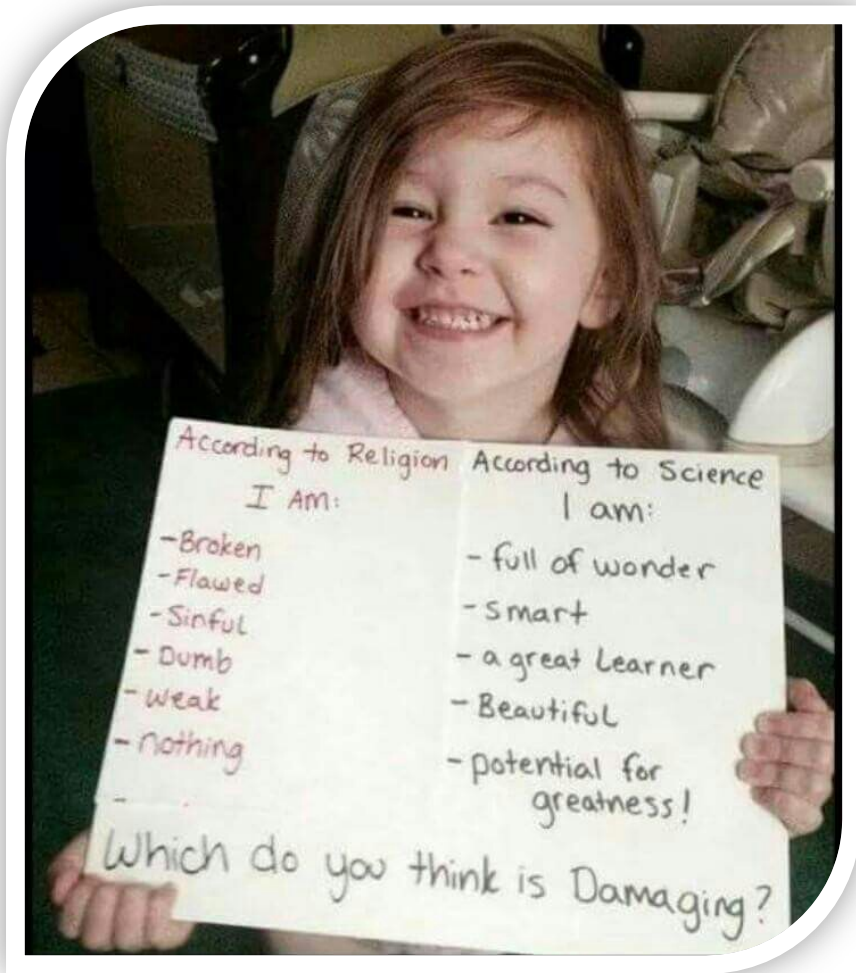

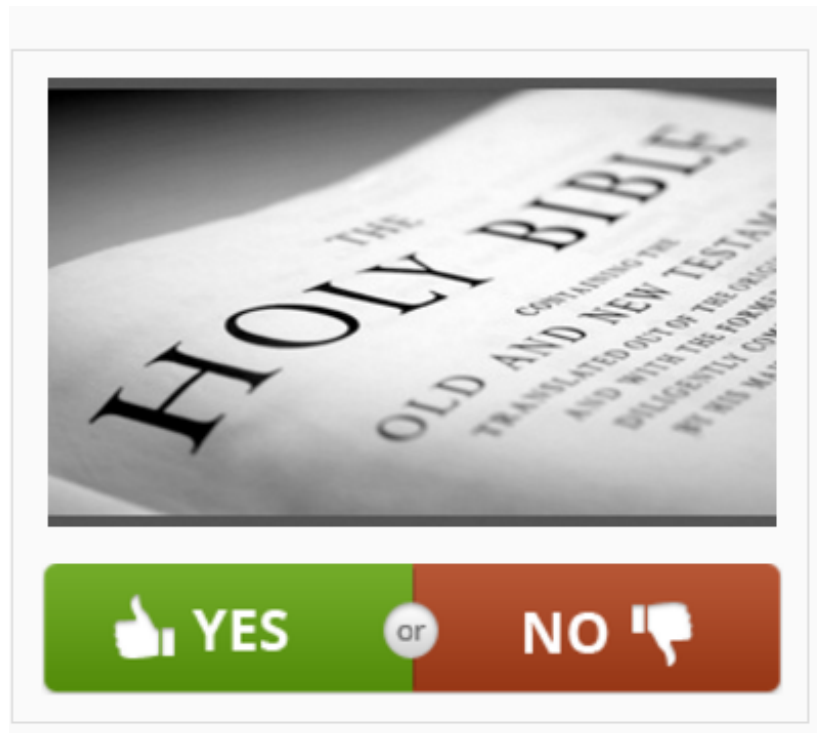

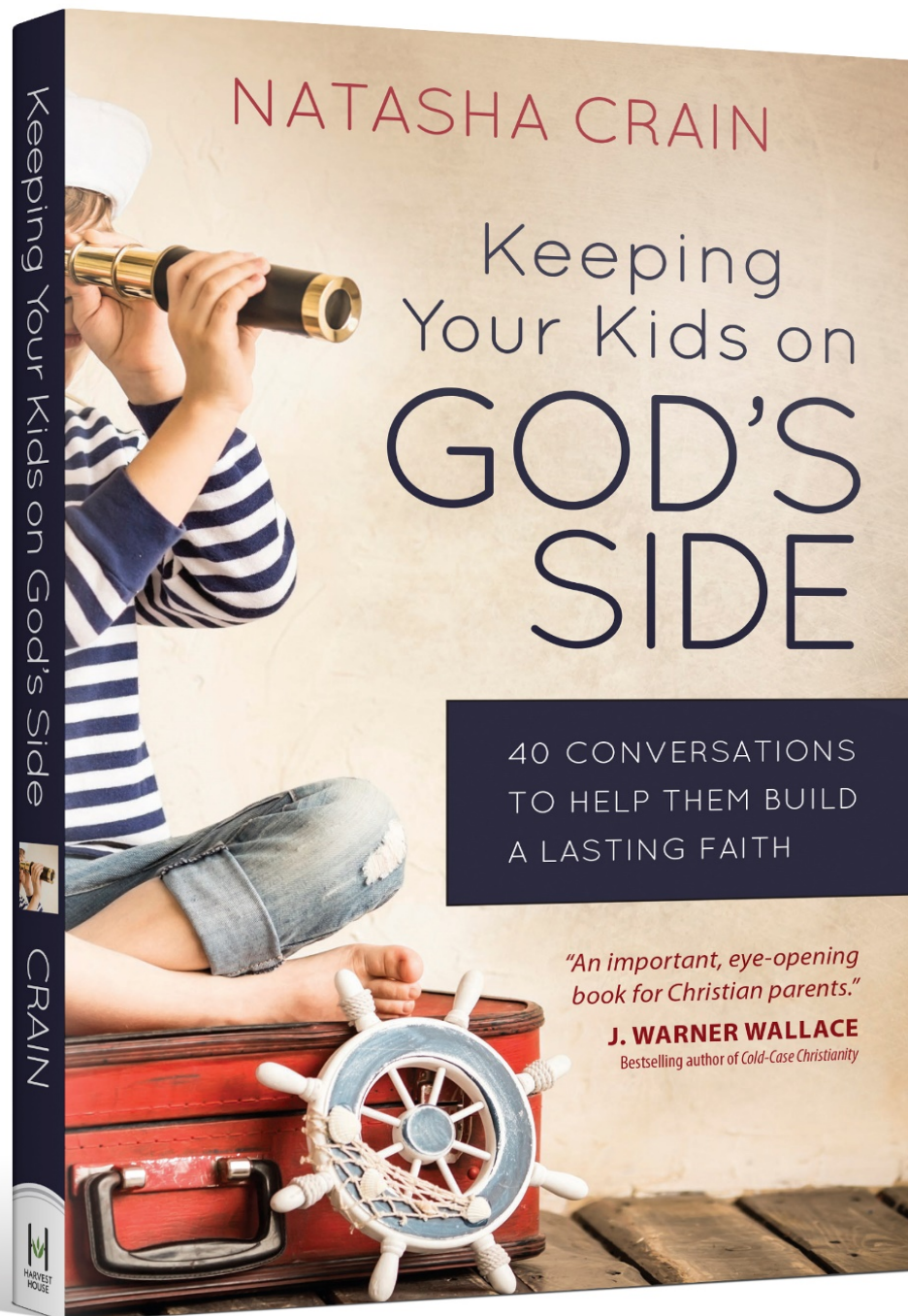

Bridging the “GAP” that exists between parents knowing the world will challenge their kids’ faith...and knowing what to do about it.

The Vision

- Launch ongoing GAP chapters in host churches, Christian schools, and homeschool groups around the world to equip parents with an understanding of apologetics and facilitate fellowship amongst like-minded parents
- GAP groups complete two 10- or 12-week studies together each year: one in fall and one in winter/spring
- First study: *Keeping Your Kids on God's Side* by Natasha Crain



An “Apologetics 101” for parents

No prior knowledge of apologetics necessary!

Covers 40 of the most important faith subjects parents and kids need to understand today, including questions like:

- What evidence is there for God’s existence?
- How could a good God allow evil and suffering?
- Do all religions point to the same truth?
- How can Christians believe miracles are even possible?
- How do we know we can trust the Bible’s authors?
- Why do Christians have varying views on how and when God created the world?
