week 6: "The Sound of God's Voice"

follow-up discussion questions

- 1. What was something specific from the message this past Sunday that connected with you (an encouragement, a challenge, a new way of thinking)?
- 2. Take a few minutes to share a few recent experiences of hearing God's Voice it could be an epic ("mount of transfiguration") type moment, or just an ordinary "still, small voice" moment.
 - What gave you confidence that it was God speaking to you?
- 3. Early in his message, Scott described a scenario where a Christian defended a pursuit, that was blatantly against the call of God in Scripture, with the claim that they had talked to God about it and felt that God was saying it was ok, even right.
 - Has someone ever said something like this to you? (Or have you said something like this to another?)
 - How did you process their revelation, and how did you respond?
- 4. Prior to hearing this message, if someone had asked you, "What does God's Voice sound like?", what would you have said?
 - What are the factors that help you know when God is speaking to you?
- 5. Let's dig into the two main implications of the statement that God's Voice sounds like Jesus: (1) "What Jesus says, God says", and (2) because Jesus IS the Word of God, "God's Voice is always in the key of Jesus"
 - Which of these deep truths did you most need to hear and why?
 - How does it help you to know that God's Voice is always in the key of Jesus?
