## Becoming the Church We All Need week five: "devoted to the prayers"

follow-up discussion questions

Acts 2:42 – "They devoted themselves to... the prayers."

- What was something specific from the teaching this past Sunday that connected with you (an encouragement, a challenge, a new way of thinking)? Were there any questions that lingered for you?
- Where or how were you first introduced to prayer?
  - Who comes to mind? What setting(s)/events?
  - How do you think this impacted your early ideas about prayer?
- Prayer is both the most *ordinary* thing for a Christian and one of the grandest *mysteries*.
  - How have you experienced something of each of these?
- How has your practice and experience of prayer *changed* over the seasons of your faith and life?
  - What do you think has contributed to these changes?
- Recall Daniel's insight that the text literally says "the devoted themselves to <u>the prayers</u>..." (not just to <u>prayer</u>). One of the implications of this being that the Christians did not abandon the prayer rhythms of the jewish synagogue, but continued to participate in these prayers/times – now in the name of Jesus.
  - What, if any, difference does the example of their being devoted to "the prayers" make for you?
- What holds us back from being devoted to the prayers? And conversely, what helps you live devoted to God in prayer?
