- ✓ Take new skills into the world to minister locally and around the world!

The Interns will work directly with the Youth Pastor to:

- Build relationships with students, parents, and volunteers and model what it means to do life with God for the world;
- Assist with planning and co-ordinating Sunday and mid-week ministry activities and events designed for students in Grades 6-12;
- Support the Youth Pastor in reviewing and evaluating blind spots in the program to ensure accessibility for those with disabilities and/or sensitivities;
- Ensure implementation of Plan to Protect Child Abuse Protection Procedures;
- Review and update emergency protocols;
- Learn and study adolescent development and faith-related topics; and
- assist staff and volunteers with office duties and coordination of programs involving youth
- coordinate and schedule teams and/or volunteers and work directly with them as part of a team of program leaders focused on the continuity of our Youth and Child programs
- communicate and develop relationships with volunteers, parents, caregivers, and church
- develop leadership through the example and mentoring of experienced leaders, including pastors and senior staff with extensive experience with youth, children, administrative and technical directing, and leadership.
- observe and develop the intangible aspects of leadership in real situations: responsibility, values, initiative, honesty, and respect will be encouraged and modelled daily in the workplace
- use a variety of technology including scheduling, social media, and office applications

Note: the individual's skills and strengths may allow other responsibilities through the term.
